A formal meeting was held with **the District Collector, Theni,** on 17.06.2026. The meeting was attended by the **District Differently Abled Welfare Team,** the CSP team, key experts, and Block Coordinators on behalf of CSP.

During the meeting, the CSP team presented an overview of the TN Rights Project, highlighting its

objectives, key interventions, and activities being implemented across the district. The team also shared the progress of the project, including achievements, ongoing initiatives, community engagement efforts, capacity-building activities, and support provided to persons with disabilities.

The District Collector appreciated the efforts of the CSP team in promoting the rights and inclusion of persons with disabilities and encouraged continued coordination with government departments and stakeholders to ensure the effective implementation of the TN Rights Project and to maximize its impact across Theni district.



TN RIGHTS Project – Monthly Review Meeting | Kallakurichi District

The Monthly Review Meeting of the Tamil Nadu RIGHTS Project was held at the District Collectorate, Kallakurichi, under the guidance of the District Administration. The meeting was attended by Mr. Anthony Raj, (DDAWO), Mr. Kannan, (JRO), Dr. Ramachandran, CSP-ARVI TRUST, Mr. Saravanan (K-1), Mr. Davidson (K-2), along with all 12 Block Coordinators, Block Rehabilitation Specialists, Community Facilitators (CFs), and Community Rehabilitation Workers (CRWs).

The review focused on strengthening the implementation of the Tamil Nadu RIGHTS Project and ensuring timely achievement of project targets. Officials emphasized the immediate completion of all pending PDS Verification, UDID Verification, and Need Assessment activities through the SPDS App. The upcoming ALIMCO Camp for the month was also reviewed, and necessary preparations were discussed.

To improve field efficiency, all staff were instructed to keep their project tablets active with a valid SIM card and data recharge. CW Psychologists and HI Special Educators were directed to closely monitor field activities and submit regular reports to the Head Office. Staff leave was restricted to one day per month, with any additional leave requiring prior approval from the Head Office.

Special emphasis was placed on service delivery. Home-Based Training (HBT) Specialists were instructed to visit a minimum of six beneficiaries each day and to carry therapy materials, educational aids, play materials, and training equipment during every home visit. Staff working in operational One-Stop Social Care Centres (OSCs) were advised to avoid unnecessary leave to ensure uninterrupted services. It was also reiterated that beneficiaries should not continue receiving services from an OSC for more than three consecutive months, enabling wider community outreach and equitable access to services.



Illuminating Hope on World Multiple Sclerosis Day



On May 30th, the **Viluthugal one stop center in Thuraiyur Block** hosted a vital awareness program to observe World Multiple Sclerosis Day. The event brought together over 10 Differently Abled Persons (DAPs), medical professionals, and organizers for an informative session on symptoms, treatments, and daily management.



Beyond sharing crucial health education, the initiative fostered deep communal support and solidarity among attendees. The successful program concluded by significantly empowering participants with a clearer, more hopeful understanding of navigating the condition.



Nursing Seminar

On 09.06.2026, A small seminar conducted for the Kana Vilakku, Government Medical College Hospital, Theni. 44 nursing students and 2 staff members actively participated in this awareness session led by Mr. Ravi, community rehabilitation Trainer from ARVI Wheels, the session covered ARVI's vision and mission, disability awareness, Wheels Program goals, 21 types of disabilities, and government welfare schemes for persons with disabilities. The nursing students gained practical insights through interactive theoretical learning and individual doubt clarification. This session connected healthcare learning with the mission of ensuring welfare reaches every person with a disability.

Persons with Disabilities Through Collective Action

To promote inclusion and economic empowerment, TNRIGHTS is facilitating the formation of self-help groups for persons with disabilities across Theni district. These groups encourage mutual support, regular savings, access to loan assistance through Mahalir Thittam, and participation in skill development programmes. By working together, members strengthen their financial independence, improve their livelihoods, and actively contribute to their communities.

Operating across key locations in the district (Booths over all)—the tireless team provided crucial wheelchair navigation and personal assistance right from the polling gates. Their incredible efforts empowered **differently abled persons and senior citizens** to cast their votes independently, fostering true democratic inclusion and ensuring no citizen was left behind.



Community outreach programme

Across late June, dynamic community outreach activities were successfully conducted in the Theni Rural block to bridge the gap between vital support services and local citizens. On June 23rd, organizers met with the residents of **Kuppinaayakkanpatti Panchayat**, and on June 29th, they held a specialized meeting with Anganwadi staff in Unjampatti Panchayat.

In both sessions, teams delivered crucial, comprehensive briefings on TN Rights schemes, **One Stop Centre (OSC) resources, and Neighborhood Health Center (NHC) services**. By directly engaging both local residents and frontline childcare workers, these initiatives have significantly strengthened the community's healthcare and welfare safety net.



Throughout the summer vacation, ARVI Trust ensured continuous learning through telerehabilitation, regular phone-based classes, and creative home activities. **Children engaged in drawing, colouring, chart work, and crafts using simple materials, strengthening their creativity and functional skills.**

These activities prevented learning gaps while encouraging independence and active family participation. Together, we nurtured every child's growth beyond the classroom.
