CSP - Theni

Visit by World Bank Delegation

A distinguished delegation from the World Bank recently visited the Musiri Outreach Service Center in Uppilyapuram to evaluate current initiatives and recommend enhancements. The team—comprising Mr. Pravesh Kumar and Mr. Subamsingh from World Bank team, alongside Mr. Ravichandran, DDAWO, Mr. Ramesh, Nodal Officer for TN RIGHTS - conducted an in-depth review of the center's operations, infrastructure, and community outreach programs.

They provided targeted recommendations to align the facility with best practices modeled at Kannagi Nagar, Chennai suggesting optimized spatial layouts, improved resource accessibility, and refined service-delivery protocols. Interactive discussions with staff and stakeholders informed these insights, ensuring practical applicability.

The delegation's expert guidance will inform the implementation of proposed modifications and is expected to elevate the center's capacity to serve beneficiaries more effectively. Trichy Collector – Preparation Assessment

"As per the instructions of the State Commissioner and the directive of District Collector Mr. M. Pradeep Kumar, IAS, a visit was conducted today to the OSC Centre at EB Road Urban Primary Health Centre, Srirangam. The Collector interacted with beneficiaries and parents, emphasizing the importance of enhanced services for the community.

The event was inaugurated by Mr. R. Ravichandran, DDAWO, and attended by PHC Medical Officer Dr. Suresh, MBBS, second-level officers, DPOs, TN RIGHTS - ARVI TRUST - CSP, Key Experts, Centre Managers, BCs, and all block staff. The Collector also inspected the TN Rights Project to ensure quality service delivery.

Additionally, OSC centers in Musiri subdivision, Pulivalam, Thanthangarpur, and Uppiliyapuram were visited by Panchayat leaders and BDOs, marking the commencement of services after the grand inauguration by our Hon'ble Chief Minister."



Orientation Training at Chennai for Community Service Providers

A three-day residential orientation training was successfully conducted in Chennai (Hotel Hablis) for the implementation of the TN RIGHTS Phase III project. Key Experts from Theni and Pudukkottai, including DDAWOs Kamatchi (Theni) and Ulaganathan (Pudukkottai), participated actively, gaining in-depth knowledge on project execution.

The event featured detailed visual presentations and implementation strategies, offering practical insights into the initiation and rollout process. The training was conducted under the valuable guidance of esteemed state-level officials including Sankar Sir, Rajarajan Sir, and Aravind Sir.

Our team, including CSP Ramachandra and Vanitha from the Management Unit, represented the districts effectively. The sessions helped enhance understanding and coordination across all districts involved in this phase.

This orientation marks a crucial step in equipping district teams with the tools and clarity needed to implement TN RIGHTS successfully, ensuring rights-based service

delivery reaches every corner of the state.

CSP - Pudukkottai, Theni



Training Session on Case Management Tool

"A structured training session on the Case Management Tool was successfully organized at the GDP Hall, Collectorate, Trichy, led by Mr. Sankar, Program Manager – RIGHTS. The training brought together the full B-OSC team, including Community Facilitators (CFs), Community Rehabilitation Workers (CRWs), and Key Experts from across the district.

The session aimed to enhance participants' understanding and practical skills in using the digital case management application, with a focus on its features, functionality, and relevance to field-level operations. Detailed guidance was provided on model data entry, case documentation, and real-time tracking to ensure consistency and quality in service delivery.

The training also included hands-on demonstrations and interactive discussions to clarify doubts and encourage adoption of best practices. This initiative plays a crucial role in strengthening data-driven approaches and improving the overall effectiveness of community-based rehabilitation efforts under the RIGHTS project."



Induction Training on Community Facilitator and Community Rehab Worker

A 3-day induction training was successfully conducted in Trichy district for frontline workers of the TN RIGHTS project, including Community Facilitators and Community Rehabilitation Workers. The training covered all 18 blocks, with four blocks trained per batch over six days at the Tamilnadu Laity Commission Hall, Trichy.

The objective was to equip participants with foundational knowledge on DAPs and their roles in implementing project activities during the pilot phase. The program featured interactive teaching, virtual learning, and practical demonstrations on community-level support for persons with disabilities.

DDAWO Mr. Ravichandran efficiently organized and led the training, with support and guidance from second-level officer Mr. Ramesh. State officials Mr. Rajarajan and Mr. Kariappan inspected and motivated the teams. Sessions were led by DPOs Ms. Geetha and Ms. Gracy, with Mr. Shanthakumar as a special guest.

Participants received the TN RIGHTS booklet, learned the project's purpose and outcomes, and were awarded certificates upon completion.

Residential Training on Deafblindness – SPASTN, Chennai

Ms. Vanitha and Ms. Arthi participated in a three-day residential training at SPASTN, Chennai, focused on understanding and supporting individuals with deafblindness and low vision. They gained insights into assessment methods, rehabilitation services, and the ongoing work of Sense India in Tamil Nadu. Engaging activities and discussions enriched their experience, deepening their knowledge and empathy, while strengthening their capacity to support persons with multiple sensory impairments.

Clinical Exposure Nursing Students - Ramachandran

An awareness session was conducted by Dr A. Ramachandran, for the Diploma Nursing students of GH Nursing College at Kana Vilakku, in collaboration with Arvi Trust Special School, Theni. The session focused on Home-Based Training (HBT) covering 21 types, government schemes for persons with disabilities, and the importance of early identification. Nursing students actively participated, gaining valuable insights into inclusive care, early intervention, and community-based rehabilitation practices.



A training session was conducted for BSc Nursing students from Theni Medical College and Bhuvaneshwar Nursing College at Arvi Trust Special School, Theni. The session focused on Home-Based Training (HBT) covering 21 types, Government Schemes, and Early Identification of disabilities. The students were also introduced to the TNRights initiative, which aims to promote inclusive healthcare and support services for persons with disabilities, enhancing their clinical knowledge and awareness.
